Artistic Contribution by Alisa Gibet

To mark the 300th birthday of César van Hoensbroek, the penultimate Prince-Bishop of Liège and former resident of Château Oost, a portrait of him painted by Alisa Gibet was unveiled during an official ceremony on 28 August 2024. The renowned artist, originally from Saint Petersburg, lived for a time in the farmhouse of Van Oys, adding an extra dimension to the artwork.

During my training, I learned to portray people using techniques from the old masters. The art lies in visualising the character of the person being depicted. I have since been commissioned to portray several individuals from different eras, ranging from the 17th century to the present. Each portrayed individual has a connection to the castle, and each portrait will have a prominent place in one of the château's suites, thereby bringing its history to life. My portraits form a story in colour that each guest can interpret in their own way. While painting, I drew inspiration from the techniques and styles of the old masters; it is my way of creating a link with the historical past of the hotel complex. Naturally, I am deeply honoured to be a part of this grand project, and I sincerely thank the brothers Michel and Leon Maes for this opportunity.
